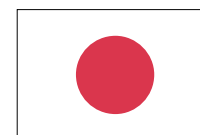

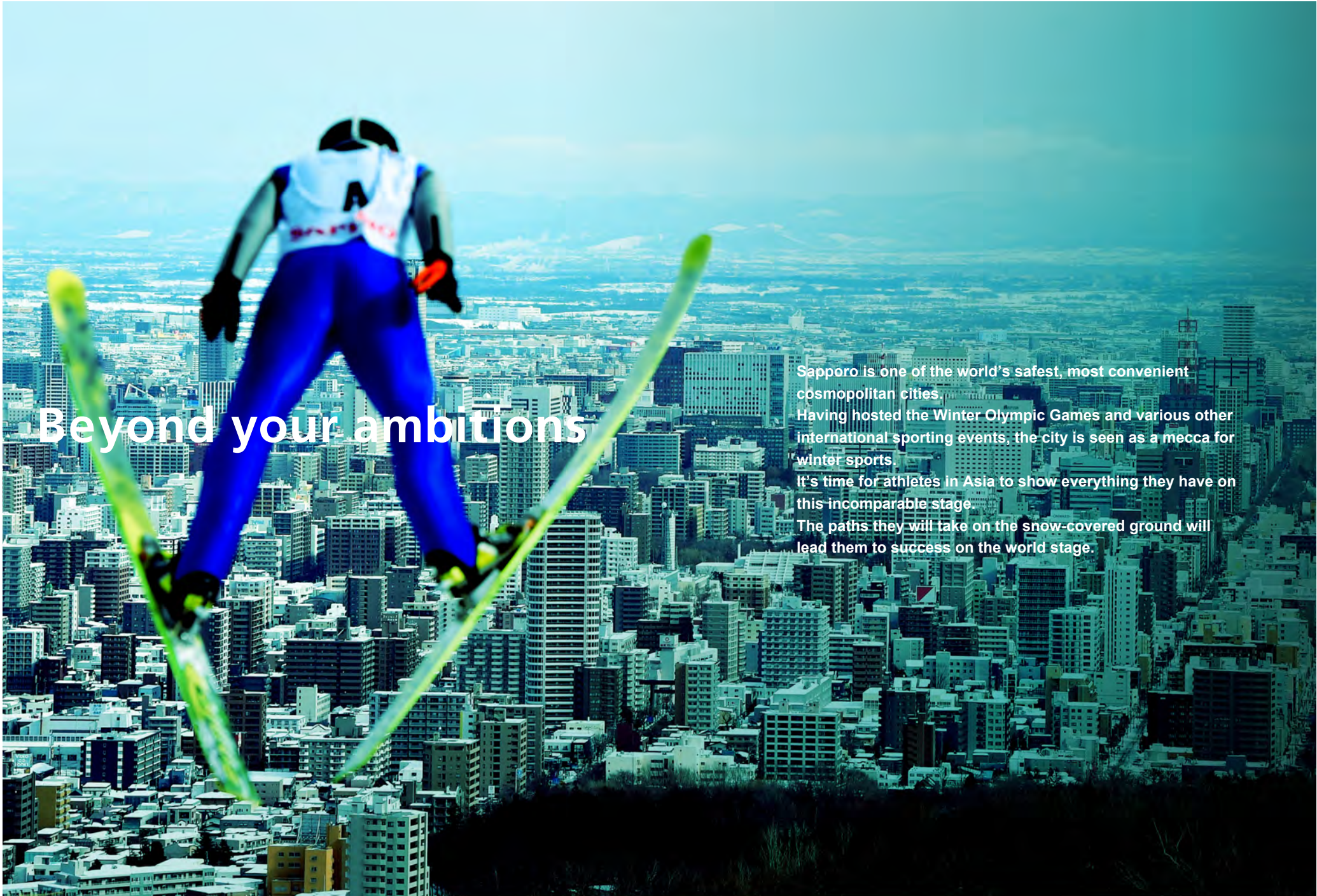

Official Logo

The official logo was chosen from among proposals submitted by the Japanese public.

The overall form of the logo represents Hokkaido – the northernmost of Japan's four main islands – as a whole. It also has design elements echoing the North Star shining in the night sky, a snow crystal and the winter breeze.

The five blue arcs themselves represent the five sports of the Games and the people from the five Asian regions who will assemble in the host cities of Sapporo and Obihiro and work together to ensure the success of the event. They also signify the assembly and collaboration of representatives from the five regions under the OCA symbolized by the sun in the middle.

The arcs also further represent the organizers' hopes that the influence of this winter sporting event will develop and spread along with Hokkaido's international profile.



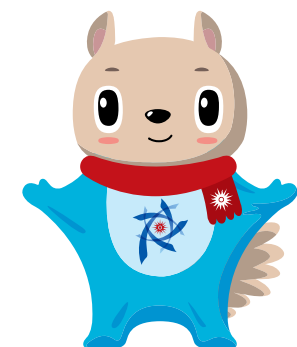
Official Mascot

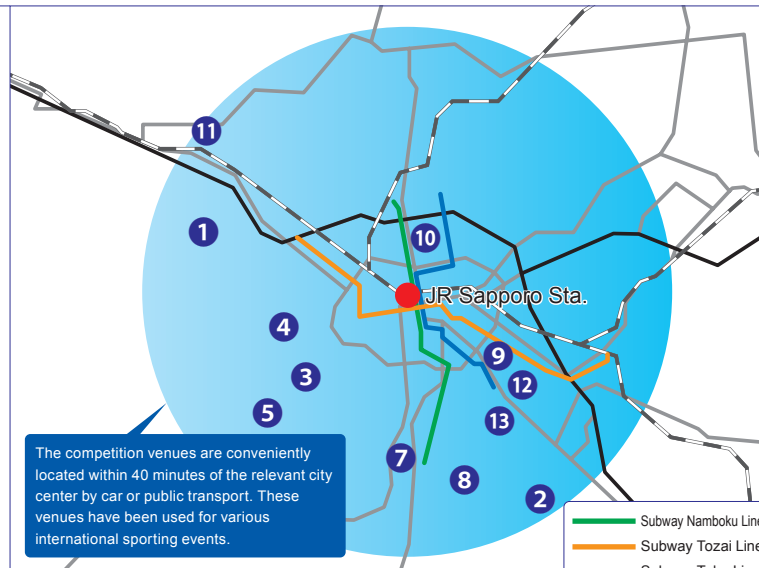

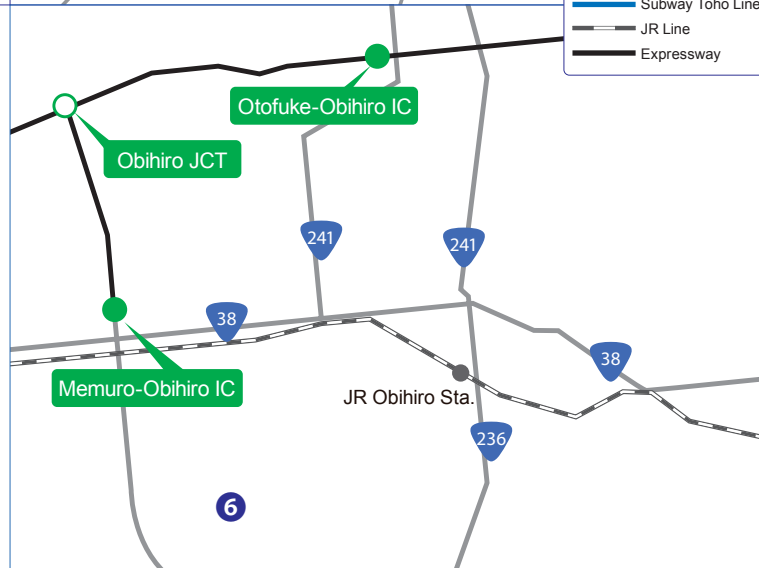

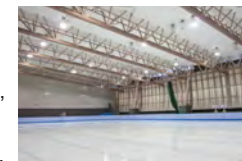

Accreditation and Validation

Asian Winter Games Identification and Accreditation Cards (AWGIACs) produced by the 8th Sapporo Asian Winter Games Organising Committee (SAWGOC) will be issued to establish identity and give the right of access to specific Games venues and zones so that holders can perform their functions at the 2017 Sapporo Asian Winter Games.

SAWGOC will distribute an Accreditation Package with an Accreditation Guide to each NOCs and Responsible Organization in May 2016.

Pre-valid AWGIACs (PVCs) for approved applicants applying by Monday, September 19, 2016, will be sent to the relevant Responsible Organizations.

PVCs constitute documentation authorizing entry into Japan for overseas delegations along with a valid passport or travel document.

PVC holders are required to visit one of the Validation Counters at the Games official airport or an Accreditation Center and present their PVC along with a valid passport or travel document to have the card validated. Once this process is complete, the card can be used as an AWGIAC.

Immigration and Visas

During the period from Friday, January 20 to Monday, March 13, 2017, PVC holders are permitted multiple entries into Japan without a separate entry visa. Upon entry to Japan, overseas delegations must present a PVC and a valid passport or travel document and submit an Embarkation/ Disembarkation Card.

Delegates who do not have a PVC and who plan to stay in Japan outside the validity period will need to make their own arrangements for entry into Japan in accordance with Japanese immigration law.

Individuals using their PVC as a visa to enter Japan must ensure that their passport is valid after Monday, March 13, 2017 and that the details on the passport match the information provided on the application for accreditation.

Games Official Airport and Flight Information

The official airport for the 2017 Sapporo Asian Winter Games is New Chitose Airport, which is located in the city adjacent to Sapporo.

Overseas delegations are strongly advised to initially enter Japan via New Chitose Airport in order to take advantage of the related support provided there by SAWGOC.

SAWGOC will distribute Online Arrival and Departure System (ADS) manuals to Responsible Organizations around August 2016.

Responsible Organizations are required to enter correct flight information for all confirmed applicants into the ADS by the deadline.

Transportation Services

Transportation Services for Arrival and Departure

Transportation services between New Chitose Airport and the Athletes' Hotel will be provided for participating athletes and officials in accordance with their flight schedules.

NOC Dedicated Vehicle Services

Based on the number of delegates per NOC, dedicated vehicle services between the Athletes' Hotel and areas designated by SAWGOC will be provided for athletes and officials.

Transportation Services for Competitions and Training

Transportation services between the Athletes' Hotel and the venues will be provided for athletes and officials participating in competitions or official training.

Transportation Services for Opening/Closing Ceremonies

Transportation services between the Athletes' Hotel and the venues will be provided for athletes and officials participating in the Opening or Closing Ceremonies.

Transportation Services for Competition Viewing

Transportation services between the Athletes' Hotel and the venues will be provided for athletes and officials wishing to watch competitions. However, transportation services for athletes and officials participating in the competitions will take priority.

Transportation Services for Luggage

If the luggage brought by athletes or officials exceeds the capacity of the buses used for their transportation, extra vehicles will be provided for luggage.

*The above transportation services will be provided only in Sapporo. Details of Obihiro transportation services will be announced separately.

Athletes' Hotels

The Apa Hotel & Resort Sapporo will serve as the Athletes' Hotel for athletes and officials staying in Sapporo. The opening period will be from Sunday, February 12 to Monday, February 27, 2017.

Meals and Catering Services

Three buffet-style meals will be served to athletes and officials at the Athletes' Hotels daily.

The menu will incorporate a wide variety of food, including Japanese and other types of Asian cuisine, and will accommodate requirements for diverse preferences related to religious and ethnic backgrounds.

Lunch boxes will be provided for athletes and officials unable to eat at the Athletes' Hotels due to their schedule.

Catering services for athletes and officials will be provided at each competition venue.

Medical Services

During the Games, SAWGOC will run Medical Stations for athletes at each venue and provide onsite medical services and emergency transport. Medical staff will be stationed at an Athletes' Hotel Medical Station, "clinic", to provide care and treatment. If advanced care is needed, patients will be transferred to the Games' designated hospitals.

AWGIAC holders who are not athletes or officials may undergo medical treatment at the clinic or designated hospitals free of charge for acute illnesses, severe injuries or acute exacerbations of chronic conditions. If necessary, medical services such as emergency treatment, hospitalization and emergency transfer will be provided. Free medical services will not include non-essential medical care nor elective medical treatment.

Opening and Closing Ceremonies

The Opening and Closing Ceremonies will be held as detailed below.

Opening Ceremony: Sunday, February 19, 2017, at Sapporo Dome

Closing Ceremony: Sunday, February 26, 2017, at Makomanai Indoor Skating Rink

Athletes attending the Opening Ceremony are required to wear their delegation uniforms. NOC representatives will bear their delegation flag during the athletes' parade at the Opening Ceremony.

Cultural Program

A Japanese Cultural Program will be run at the Athletes' Hotel during the Games to provide athletes with experience of aspects of traditional Japanese culture such as kimono dressing and the tea ceremony.

Welcome Ceremony

The 2017 Sapporo Asian Winter Games Welcome Ceremony will be held at the Athletes' Hotel with timing based on delegates' arrival dates/times.

Volunteers

Skilled volunteers with significant experience of international sporting events and young volunteers will provide support for the Games, and look forward to welcoming athletes and officials from all over Asia.

Press Conferences

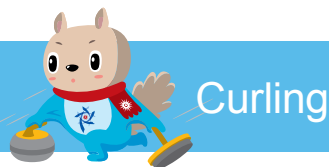

Competition Rules and Regulations

Curling competitions will be conducted in accordance with the World Curling Federation (WCF) Official Rules of Curling and Rules of Competition applicable to the Games.

Eligibility

All OCA-member NOCs are entitled to enter athletes in each event. Participating curlers must meet all the requirements of the OCA Constitution and Rules.

Technical Delegates & Competition Officials

At the request by SAWGOC, the WCF will appoint Technical Delegates and the JCA will appoint Ice Technicians, Umpires, Timers and other officials.

OCA reserves the right to propose the appointment of any Technical Delegates to the WCF with justified reason.

Draw/System of Play

The Curling competition will be played in the following stages:

- Double round-robin games
- Tiebreaker games
- Bronze medal games
- Gold medal games

Results

An electronic timing system will be used, and results will be produced and announced in accordance with the WCF Official Rules of Curling and Rules of Competition.



Victory Ceremonies

After competitions, victory ceremonies will be held at competition venues to honor the three best-placed teams in each event. Gold, silver and bronze medals will be presented to teams ranked first, second and third. Certificates will also be given to the top six teams individually (rather than at victory ceremonies).

Protests and Appeals

Protests shall be resolved under the current WCF Rules of Play and Competition Handbook. The Chief Umpire will decide the outcome of all protests and appeals related to the Rules of Play. Any disputes not resolved under the WCF Rules and Regulations or the OCA Constitution and Rules may be referred to the Court of Arbitration for Sport (CAS).

Doping Control

Doping control during the 2017 Sapporo Asian Winter Games will be conducted in accordance with the OCA Anti-Doping Rules and the WCF Anti-Doping Rules applicable to the Games, and will comply with the World Anti-Doping Code and its relevant International Standards.

In collaboration with the Medical Committee of the OCA, SAWGOC will arrange the resources to handle the investigation of any cases involving disorders of sexual determination. The need for related tests and the processes to be followed will be as per the rules/procedures laid down by the OCA.
