1.5 Mascots



Personification of three harbor seal brothers and sister, very rare species, living in the Baekryong Isles, located on the western Korean peninsula. They call themselves, Vichuon (Light), Barame (Wind), and Chumuro (Dance). These seals roam freely between two Koreas beyond the ideology and conflicts, therefore carry the desire for unity, which Asia has longed for.

2. Accreditation and Validation

Asian Games Identification and Accreditation Cards (AGIAC) will act as an entry visa to Korea and ensure special access to the Games venues including the HQ Hotel and competition venues. IAGOC will distribute Accreditation Guide and Accreditation Application Forms to Accreditation Responsible Organizations by December 2013. The online Accreditation System will open on December 1, 2013. The deadline for the submission of the application forms is April 30, 2014. IAGOC will distribute the Pre-valid AGIAC to the confirmed participants from August 2014. Upon the arrival in Incheon, pre-valid AGIAC holders should visit one of the accreditation centers with their effective identification documents and validate their pre-valid AGIAC. Once validated, AGIAC becomes an official Games document.



3. Immigration and Visa

From August 20 to October 19, 2014, AD Card holders will be permitted multiple entries into Korea upon presentation of their valid passports or travel documents. AD Card holders will not need to apply for a Korean Entry Visa or Residence Permit in order to enter the country (Provided that the press are allowed to enter Korea without visa for 90 days, from July 22, 2014 to October 19, 2014, which can afford every facility for the press).

Any AD Card holder wishing to enter Korea before or after the valid period of the AD Card, or to remain in Korea after its expiry date, will need to make their own arrangements regarding visas according to Korean immigration law.

AD Card holders should ensure that the information on their valid passport when entering Korea is exactly the same with the information on the certified document used for application for AD Card, and that their passports remain valid at least until October 19, 2014.

4. Transportation

4.1 Transport Services for Arrival and Departure

Shuttle Bus Services will be provided for arriving and departing athletes and team officials, depending on arrival and departure information and flight schedule. Before departure, Shuttle Bus Services require advance reservation.

4.2 Dedicated Vehicle Services

Dedicated Vehicle Services will be provided between Athletes' Village and the designated areas, depending on team events and on the size of NOC participants. Dedicated Vehicle Services require advance reservation and approval.

4.3 Transport Services for Competitions (for non-team events)

Shuttle Bus Services for athletes and team officials participating in non-team events will be provided between Athletes' Village and the competition venues as per the competition schedule.

4.4 Transport Services for Training (for non-team events)

Shuttle Bus Services for athletes and team officials participating in non-team events will be provided between Athletes' Village and the training venues as per the training schedule.



4.5 Transport Services for Spectating

The AV-to-venues shuttle will be provided to athletes and team officials wishing to watch other sport competition events. The service is also available to all athletes and team officials who are involved in the same events: priority, however, will be given to athletes and team officials participating in their own events.

* Tickets are required for spectating.

4.6 Transport Services for Luggage

The luggage belonging to athletes and team officials should, in principal, be loaded onto the bus they take. If not possible due to insufficient storage space, another vehicle will be provided to the destinations.

5. Accommodation

During the Games time, over 13,000 athletes and team officials including extra officials will be accommodated at Incheon Guwol Asiad Athletes' Village located in Incheon. Pre-opening of Athletes' Village will be on September 5, 2014. The Athletes' Village will officially be open on September 12, 2014 and will close on October 7, 2014. A variety of amenities and recreational facilities will be offered for the Games family at Athletes' Village. For the sake of the safety, separate signage is required for entering the area.

6. Media

6.1 Mixed Zone

the convenience of Mixed Zone.

The Mixed zone is an area in which athletes may be interviewed as soon as they leave the field of play. The Mixed Zone is designed to permit the broadcasters and press to interview athletes in a designated area near the field of play. In accordance with OCA's rules, all athletes must pass through the Mixed Zone. Mixed Zone interviews are recommended within limited time each to let the broadcasters and press to have an equal opportunity to speak to the athletes. The AFs and IAGOC Sports Operations Team will provide all necessary assistance to ensure



6.2 Press Conference

After each event, the designated medalists will attend a press conference at the venue as well as coaches if circumstances dictate. They should accompany to the press conference room. Medalists press conference will be held right after the medal presentation ceremonies at the venue. Sports operational staff will bring athletes to the press conference room.

Translation services will be provided with English and Korean during the press conferences at the venues. If medalists do not speak English or Korean, NOCs are requested to assign an interpreter with the medalists attending the press conference.

7. Medical Service

Medical stations for athletes will be installed at all competition venues and training facilities.

On-site medical treatment and emergency transfer service will be provided during operating period. Polyclinic in the Athletes' Village will provide treatment and consultation by professional medical staff across the departments of internal medicine, general surgery (including orthopedics). ophthalmology, stomatology, medical imaging, physical therapy, pharmacy, etc.

It will also have an emergency room open 24 hours a day, with stand-by ambulances. Any patient who needs further diagnosis and treatment will be transferred to designated hospitals of the Games.

Where accredited persons including OCA Family VIP quests, NOC quests suffer from acute diseases, acute exacerbations of chronic diseases or acute injuries, they can receive treatment in Polyclinic or designated hospitals for free of charge. Services may include emergency treatment, in-patient service, special consultation and ambulance transfer, if required. However, free medical services will not include selective or unnecessary treatment.

8.2 Incheon in brief

Introduction to Incheon

The name "Incheon" was first used in the late Goryeo Era. Before then, Incheon was called "Michuhol" in the Baekie Era, Incheon was the first city to experience civilization through trade. religion and education. The constant foreign invasions eventually made the people of Incheon realize the importance of modern education and search for international experiences. After the construction of Gyeonabu Expressway, Incheon's geographic importance in exchanges with China was realized and Incheon International Airport, one of the world's most advanced airports, was built on Yeongiong Island, making Incheon the hub of Northeast Asia. In addition, Incheon Free Economic Zone was designated in 2003 and now is an international city.

Transportation

The so-called Penta-port City, Incheon has a superb traffic infrastructure with unparalleled accessibility. It features the world's finest Incheon International Airport, Incheon Port, the 1st and 2nd Gyeongin Highways, the West Coast Highway, the Yeongdong Highway, and the Seoul Outer Beltway, Incheon is also geographically close to Seoul, and the two cities are well connected.

Area and Location

The current administrative unit covers a total area of 1,032.41km², or 1% of South Korea between 36° 55′ - 37° 58′ N and 124° 36′ - 126° 47′ E.

Population

As of October 2013, the city has a total population of 2,923,456 with more than 1,115,516 households. Incheon is rapidly developing into the third largest city in Korea, following Seoul and Busan, the first and the second largest, respectively.

Touristic Resources

Incheon enjoys rich touristic resources and the famous Eight Top Scenic Spots of Incheon like Wolmi Culture Street, Chinatown, Memorial Hall for Incheon Landing Operation, Songdo Central Park, Incheon Grand Park, Sorae Port, Rodeo Street, Bupyeong Underground Shopping Center, etc. More detailed information on Incheon tour will be found at http://itour.visitincheon.org and provided with English, Chinese, Japanese and Korean.



9. Weather Condition

Korea is geographically situated in the Far East of Northern Hemisphere. It has a moderate climate and is characterized with distinctive four seasons such as spring, summer, autumn and winter.

Incheon is located in the mid-west of the Korean peninsula with an average sea level low, abutting the west sea. Incheon has a relatively dry climate and is also greatly affected by seasonal winds.

The average annual temperature is approximately 12.1°C, with an average rainfall of 1,234.4mm and relative humidity of 69% respectively.

It is said to have a pleasant climate condition, a small rainfall and long sunshine hours while approaching the end of September. It is an optimum weather for athletes to play and perform in its best weather condition.

6. Competition Rules

The Judo competition of the 17th Asian Games will be held in accordance with the IJF Sports

and Organization Rules (SOR), Refereeing Rules and JUA Sports and Organization Rules (SOR).

Pursuant to OCA Constitution and Rules, JUA through the appointed TD assumes the responsibility for the technical control and direction of Judo competition of the Asian Games.

In case of any disagreement in the language interpretation of the rules and regulations, the

English version shall prevail. Any unforeseen cases not covered by the regulations and rules

shall be resolved as follows:

· General issues: Resolved in accordance with the OCA Constitution and Rules

Technical issues: Resolved in accordance with the IJF Rules and Regulations

7. Competition Format

The following system of competition will be used during 17th Asian Games:

Under the supervision of the Asian Judo Union, the competitor of each weight category will be divided into two tables by means of a computerized "draw", double repechage tournament

shall be conducted in the game.

The competitors defeated in the quarter-final will compete in the repechage, two losers of the first repechage are placed seventh. Two losers of the second repechage are placed fifth. The

winners of each of these two repechage contests will compete in bronze medal contests

against the loser of the semi-final contest of the respective opposite table.

Repechage and semifinal of the same weight categories shall be held simultaneously on two

mats, The bronze medals contest and the finals will be held on one mat.

The team contests will be fought in the following order:

Women: -52kg; -57kg; -63kg; -70kg; +70kg

Men: -66kg; -73kg; -81kg; -90kg; +90kg

Each competitor is entitled to fight in his own weight category or in the next higher category.

Two reserves are allowed for any 2 of the 5 weight categories. A team consists of 5 (five)

competitors and has the possibility to have up to 2 (two) reserves. A team has to consist of

minimum 3 (three) competitors.

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If at the end of the contest there is not at least a difference of a Yuko between the two competitors, the contest will continue according to Golden Score rule. The number of contests won will decide the winning team. If for any reason the team is composed of an even number of athletes and there is an equal number of wins and an equal number of scoring points, a random draw will be made and one couple will refight a golden score contest where the first score of any kind decides the winning team

7.1 Competition Duration

The duration of each contest shall be five (5) minutes for both men and women (actual time). No time limit for Golden Score. The contest ends as soon as a contestant is awarded first a score or the penalty over his/her opponent.

72 Draw

The draw will be conducted under the control and auspices of the TD.

7.3 Weigh - in

Weigh-in shall be conducted in the Athletes Village or venue in the Asian Games Town, under the control and supervision of the TD and officials appointed by him.

Official weigh-in for each category shall take place from 19:00 pm to 19:30 pm on the day before of the competition in that category.

Each competitor shall be allowed only one weight control up on the scale during the official weigh-in period. No tolerance shall be allowed either above or below the weight category.

The unofficial weigh-in from 18:30 pm to 19:00 pm on the official scales will be available to athletes who are competing on the day before of the competition.

Each competitor must bring to the weigh-in his/her accreditation card.

7.4 Training Arrangement

Training Requirement Form will be provided by the competition management when the NOC delegations arrive at the Athletes Village in the Asian Games Town. All teams must submit the training requirement forms to book a training session before 17:00 prior to the day of the training session, through the Sport Information Center in the Athletes Village in the Asian Games Town. Each team may book a 90-minute training session per day.



8. Sport Entries

8.1 Eligibility

- Only OCA member NOCs are entitled to send athletes to participate in the Judo competition of the 17th Asian Games.
- Only athletes who comply with the OCA Constitution and Rules and its Bye-law are entitled to participate in the Judo competition.

8.2 Entry Timeline

- Entry by Sport Deadline: 24:00 October 31, 2013 (Seoul Time, GMT +9)
- Entry by Number Deadline: 24:00 June 20, 2014 (Seoul Time, GMT +9)
- Entry by Name Deadline: 24:00 August 15, 2014 (Seoul Time, GMT +9)

8.3 Entry Policies

- Individual Events: Each NOC may enter only one (1) athlete in each event.
- Team Events: Each team shall enter a minimum of three (3) athletes to a maximum of five (5) athletes and two (2) reserves in the Team Events.
- Total: Each NOC may enter a maximum of twelve (12) men and twelve (12) women athletes in Judo.
- * Age Limitation: The minimum age limit for athletes is 15 (born on December 31, 1999 or before) years old. For those athletes who have not attained their majority (legal adult age), authority from their parents should be obtained.
- * NOCs that withdraw their athletes or teams after the submission of the final entries by name and Team Sport Draw will be faced with disciplinary action by the OCA EB.



9. Technical Officials

9.1 Technical Officials & Jury of Appeals

Technical officials and Jury Members shall be appointed by the TD representing JUA.

92 Referees

Referees will be nominated by the TD representing JUA who shall hold International Referee License.

A team may bring one Team Referee who shall hold International Referee License, whereas host country of Korea may provide a total of 4 Referees (maximum) who shall hold International Referee License.

** AF/IF has the right to appoint the Technical Delegate and ITOs in coordination and
 approval of OCA. In case of violation of the IF/AF Rules and Games Rules and Regulations
 by any participant, the OCA has the right to revoke the AD Card and propose change of the
 person to the concerned party.

11. Protests and Appeals

All Contests will use 3 Referees assigned to each contest mat with

- One (1) On-Mat Referee &
- Two (2) Matside Referees

These will be interconnected through Wireless Radio communication system and

- Matside Referee will oversee the Care System.
- The Jury will only intervene if necessary.
- Hantei is cancelled, replaced by use of golden score without time limit (until first score or first violation, ends contest).

All appeals related to the technical sides will be the responsibilities of the International and Asia Federations.

** Any Athlete/NOC can appeal to CAS, in case he feels that there is violation of IF/AF Technical Rules or OCA Constitution which is not related to reversing the decision of the referee or result.



12. Equipment & Clothing

Equipment used and clothing worn by athletes and other relevant participants in competition must comply with the rules and regulations (including specifications) of the OCA and IJF and JUA in force.

Each Judoka should provide two Judoqis, one white and one blue, which are up to the standard and the spare two Judogis. The Judogis should meet the related requirements of IJF and JUA.

All training equipments shall be approved by Technical Delegate.

Neither athletes nor technical officials can attach any form of commercial advertizing to his or her competition uniform without prior agreement with OCA and IAGOC.

13. Doping Control

Doping Control during the 17th Asian Games will be conducted in accordance with OCA Anti-Doping Rules applicable to the Asian Games and will follow the standards and procedures under the World Anti - Doping programme.

IAGOC, in collaboration with the medical committee of the OCA will have in place the resources to assist in the investigation of any cases of disorders of sexual determination, should the need arise. The need for such tests and the processes to be followed will be as per the rules/procedures laid down by the OCA.

14. Victory Ceremony

Medals of the Judo competition shall be awarded under the stipulations of OCA and JUA.

First place will be awarded with a gold medal.

Second place will be awarded with a silver medal.

Two third places will be awarded with bronze medals.

Victory Ceremony of each weight category shall be held after the Final on the same day in the competition venue. Medalists must wear their white Judogi.

15. Media Interview

All athletes should pass through the Mixed Zone. Athletes and/or coaches should attend press conferences and interviews when there are interview requests for them.



16. Sport Information Center (SIC)

All sport-specific information for Judo will be available at the sport information desks. They are located at the competition venue and at the Sport Information Center (SIC) in the Athletes' Village.

17. Approval of the Technical Handbook

The Technical Handbook for Judo has been approved by the Judo Union of Asia (JUA) on November 18, 2013.


