Kazakhstan in Brief

Area: 2,724,900 km²

Population: 16,196,800

Administrative Divisions: The Republic is composed of 14 regions and three cities of republican subordination.

Currency: Kazakh tenge (100 tiyn).

Geographical Location: Kazakhstan is a state in Central Asia. In the south-west it is washed by the Caspian Sea. It borders with Russia, China, Kyrgyzstan, Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan. In the West - a part of the Caspian, and Turan lowlands, in the central part - Kazakh hills, in the north - the southern edge of the West Siberian Plain, in the East and South-East - Mountains of Altai, Tarbagatay, Jungar Alat, Tien-Shan.

Climate: The climate is continental. The average temperatures in January are from -18 C in the north to -3 C in the south, in July +19C in the north and +30C in the South. Annual precipitation in the north is from 300 mm in the desert and less than 100 mm in the mountains up to 1,600 mm.

The state language is Kazakh. In state institutions and local self-administrative bodies the Russian language is officially used on equal grounds along with the Kazakh language.

1832 — Date of foundation. Before 1961 — City of Akmolinsk

1961–1992 — City of Tselinograd

1993–1998 — City of Akmola

By the edict of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan the city of Akmola is declared Capital of the Republic of Kazakhstan on October 20th, 1997 and by the decree of the President of the Republic of Kazakhstan Akmola is renamed into the Astana on May 6th, 1998.

Geographical position: 51° 10' 00" of North latitude and 71° 25' 00" of East longitude.

Local time: Astana is in Time Zone 5. Local time in relation to the Prime Meridian is GMT +06.00

Population: 683,939 people.

The climate of Astana is the second coldest capital in the world (after Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia), with temperatures of -35 to -40 °C common in early winter. The city is also known for regular frosts for around six months every year.

Nowadays Astana is getting the image of a business center of the country. All government organizations, embassies of foreign countries, joint enterprises and foreign firms are concentrated in the new capital.

Each year the city meets guests on various international industrial exhibitions, conferences and music festivals.

ALMATY

1854 — Date of foundation

1854–1921 — City of Vernyi

1921–1997 — Alma-Ata (capital of Kazakhstan)

Almaty is a former capital of the Republic of Kazakhstan and invariably remains the largest megalopolis in the country. Since independence in 1991, the city has experienced a significant transformation from its sudden exposure to western markets.

It is located in the south-east of the country.

Geographical position: 43° 15' 00" of North latitude and 76° 54' 00" East longitude.

Local time: Almaty is in Time Zone 5. Local time in relation to the Prime Meridian is GMT +06.00

Population: 1,405,456 people.

The climate of Almaty is quite mild. It is never as cold here as in the northern parts of the country and one can easily survive without a fur hat and a fur coat. However, because of higher humidity it may seem a little colder in winter than it is in fact.

Almaty remains the largest financial, economic and cultural center of Central Asia. It accommodates numerous business centers, theaters, museums, art galleries, exhibition halls and countless modern entertainment complexes (movie theaters, nightclubs, parks, restaurants, cafes etc.)

Logo: The design of the logo goes back to the image of a nomadic bullock cart. In heraldic art the wheel serves as a symbol of eternal movement, both in space and in time. Reflecting the idea of constant development, the logo becomes an emblem of life and represents creative dynamism. The symbolism of the wheel is close to that of the circle and according to ancient beliefs it expresses the idea of the god of the Sun going around the Earth. Thus, the logo is a solar sign and represents the radiant power of a star that grants life and prosperity.

Games Services

Accreditation

All application forms for identification (ID) and accreditation cards (AD) will be available for on-line completion at the official web-site of the Games, www.astana-almaty2011.com, beginning June 1st, 2010. The deadline for completing or making changes to the application forms is October 30th, 2010.

Following the completion, the identification cards must be signed and stamped with the NOC of the respective country, which will ensure the right to enter and exit Kazakhstan with a valid passport from January 1st, 2011 to February 21st, 2011. The accreditation cards will be issued to delegates by accreditation centers once they arrive in Kazakhstan.

Transportation

Arrival to Airport

Transportation services will be provided at the international airports of Astana and Almaty. Designated vehicles will be available at the airport for transportation of arriving delegations to their hotels.

Transit Airport

Almaty international airport will serve as a transit-airport, where representatives of AWAGOC will assist participants to transfer to the flight to Astana.

Participants Transportation

It is planned to transport participants between the cities by air. However, the number of flights will differ depending on participants' status.

Local transportation of participants will be carried out using 30-seat buses which will be provided to the teams. Buses will be available at special bus-stops (parking lots), designed as part of the transport connection between the official hotels and competition/training venues, and will operate for 1-2 hours before and after competitions and trainings.

Transportation Service for Trainings and Competition

Transportation service will be provided to participants traveling between the competition venues and hotels. Any large and heavy luggage will be transported by designated vehicles.

Competition Equipment and Luggage Transportation

The Organizing Committee will help Games participants with transportation of competition equipment and luggage once they enter Kazakhstan. Games participants and their assistants are required to check their belongings, and attend the handling of their luggage together with AWAGOC representatives. The Organizing Committee will provide each team with Games luggage tags.

Accommodation & Fees

Athletes and officials of Ice Hockey competition will stay: women – «Astana International Hotel» in Almaty, men – «King Hotel» in Astana.

Accommodation fee for athletes and officials in quota:

50 \$ USD per person per day

Accommodation fee for extra officials:

100 \$ USD per person per day

Early registration and early arrivals:

100 \$ USD per person per day

Catering

The main Games catering places for officials and athletes will be located at accommodation places. It is planned to have 3 buffet-type meals a day to reflect different tastes and religious preferences and to feature national cuisines from all countries of Asia including the host country. Taking into account the climatic conditions of the host cities and the varying distances to be traveled to the sports venues, appropriate and category-specific catering will be organized on sports venues as well. This measure is designed to provide hot meals to the athletes, coaches, staff and official guests of the Games away from the host city sports facilities. Food will be provided according to the relevant symbol on the accreditation cards of Games participants.

Ice Hockey Technical Information

Ice Hockey competitions will be held at the Baluan Sholak Sport Palace in Almaty (women) from January 28th to February 3rd, 2011; and at the Kazakhstan Sports Palace in Astana (men) from January 29th to February 6th, 2011.

Trainings Schedule

All competition venues will be available for training beginning January 15th, 2011. AWAGOC will develop a training schedule for each sport according to the arrival information for each team and teams' training requests. A reasonable fee will be charged for using the venue. Free training for Ice Hockey competitions (women) will be provided beginning January 25th, 2011 and (men) will be provided beginning January 26th, 2011.

Competition Rules

The current rules of IIHF will be adopted for the Ice Hockey competition. Any issues that are not covered by the rules will be dealt with in accordance with the relevant regulations of the OCA and IIHF.

Qualification

All members of National Olympic Committees and Olympic Council of Asia whose national/regional associations are members of IIHF can join the competition.

The men's Ice Hockey competitions will be held in a two-tournament format: "Upper Division" – "A" and "First Division" – "B". The teams of China, Japan, South Korea and Kazakhstan, seeded according to their IIHF ranking, will compete in "A" tournament in a round-robin and play-off games. All other teams will compete in "B" tournament, seeded according to their qualification in the Asian Cup or Asian League in round-robin and play-off games with an equal number of teams in each group. The decision on including the medals won in "B" tournament in the final medals table will be made by the Olympic Council of Asia.

Participation of athletes must be in conformity with the qualification requirements of the OCA Constitution and Rules.

Organization of Competitions

Under the supervision and instructions of the OCA and IIHF, the technical delegates and technical officials will work with the Competition Commission of AWAGOC, a body responsible for organizing the Ice Hockey competition.

Technical Delegates and Referees

IIHF with OCA's approval will appoint technical officials, technical delegates, arbiters and referees. Other referees and competition officials will be designated by AWAGOC.

Timing

Electronic timing system will be customized to the competitions and it shall be operated in accordance with the regulations of IIHF.

Draw

All the draws related to competitions will be conducted in conformity with the IIHF regulation and under strict supervision.

Protest

All protests and appeals concerning technical aspects of the competitions will be conducted according to the IIHF regulations.

Awards

The awards to be presented to team members who rank among the first six places are as follows:

First place: gold-filled silver medal and certificate.

Second place: silver medal and certificate.

Third place: bronze medal and certificate.

Forth to sixth: certificate.

Doping Control

Doping test will be conducted under the guidance of the OCA Medical Committee and in accordance with the World Anti-Doping Code and international doping test standards. The Almaty Athletes' Anti-Doping Laboratory, which was recognized by IOC and WADA, will serve as the test lab for the Games. Test results will be issued within 72 hours. Kazakhstan Sport Palace in Astana (men) and Baluan Sholak Sport Palace in Almaty (women) will be the sites of sample collection for the athletes of Ice Hockey competitions. The number of athletes to be tested and the principles of selection will be determined by the OCA Medical Committee. In the event of any positive test result, the Chairman of OCA Medical Committee will report to the OCA and take appropriate actions on the case.

Kazakhstan Sport Palace (Astana) in Brief

Kazakhstan Sports Palace, located at 9 Munaytpasova street was put into operation in 2001. Its holding capacity is 4,050 seats and about 1,000 standing places. It is planned to have Ice Hockey competitions (men) there. Additionally, it is planned to build a training rink and reconstruct existing sports facilities on the territory of the Sports Palace. The rectangular building housing the training rink is 8,500 m² in area, consists of a 61m*30m arena, and possesses stands for 1,000 people. For visitors' convenience, the entrances are spaced around the perimeter of the building. A passage to connect the training rink and the building of Kazakhstan Sports Palace is also included in the design.

The complex consists of:

Dressing rooms for athletes, capable of serving 100 people per shift. The sizes of the dressing rooms, shower rooms, toilets and other facilities for athletes meet the requirements of Hockey Championship Regulations.

Children's Sport School with dressing-rooms, coach rooms and first aid post.

Premises of "Barys" Hockey Club

Warm-up gyms

Skate rental office;

Booking offices;

Snack bar for spectators;

Judges' rooms.

On the whole, the projected training rink building, together with the existing Sports Palace, creates a comfortable and functional sports complex, at the same time enriching the architecture of the capital.

Baluan Sholak Sport Palace (Almaty) in Brief

It is scheduled to hold Ice Hockey (women) at this venue. The reconstruction of the Palace of Sports and Culture for the Asian Winter Games 2011 competitions will make it possible to conduct not only major sporting and cultural events, but will also serve as a recreation and sports facility for the public. The overall capacity of the venue will total 5,000 persons plus an additional 1,000 seats will be installed as well. The renovation also provides for replacement of all mechanical, electrical and plumbing systems, as well as increase of support area to accommodate changing rooms, medical and recreation facilities, recreation rooms, a press center, and a commentator booth. It is also planned to build a 850-space parking lot near the Palace.

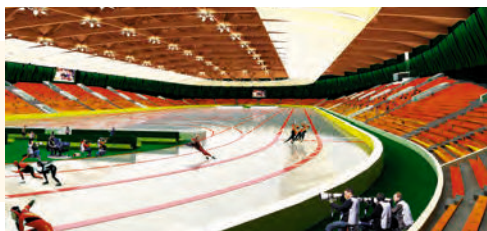
